



It is helpful to review this information each time you are working a new painting. It seems lighting is a continuing challenge. At least it is for me,

The single most important element which determines the way you paint is the light. Without light, there are no colors, no shapes, no edges, no form.

But not all light is the same. Some light is warm, some light is cool. Some light is intense, some light is weak.
