Field Trip Update

I hope everyone enjoyed the Dogwood Canyon trip.

Our last field trip of this season is scheduled for Friday Nov 30 to the Dunnegan Museum in Bolivar, MO. Some of you may know that our own Jon Thompson has a piece in this museum - you'll be impressed. The gallery has been undergoing some alterations in their facility replacing the HVAC system and therefore aren't currently hosting anv travelling shows. However, they will have both galleries hung with pieces from their permanent collection. I have seen several of these (some from past Watercolor USA shows) and I think they have an impressive collection and think vou'll find this little museum enjoyable. Admission is free.

Since the hours are limited to M-W-F, 1-4, we will be going to lunch first, then on to the gallery.

At present I'm contemplating two restaurants (both recommended by locals). One is an authentic Meditteranean venue, and prices range from \$10 and up (there are some gluten free choices). The owner learned her trade from Turkey and other Middle Eastern countries.

The other has more conventional American cuisine and the prices are a bit lower.














Gail Davis is still undergoing laser treatments 3 times a week for skin cancer.
