Senior Art Show

The art exhibition will be held at the Juanita K Hammons Hall March 8 - April 5 in 2017 - and the artist's reception will be held on March 10, from 6:30 to 8:00 PM, with the awards presentation held at 7 PM.

This exhibition is open to all visual artists age 60 or older, and a maximum of two artists may be submitted for consideration. A non-refundable donation of \$5.00 per entry will be required, and checks are to be made payable to Senior Art Exhibition Fund.

All works must be hand-delivered to the Fuldner Lounge at the JKH center on Monday, March 6th - between 1:00 and 3:00 ONLY. Works delivered after 3 PM will not be accepted. The jurying will take place the following morning and works not accepted will be returned to the artist(s) on Tuesday - in the same location - between 12:00 and 1:30 PM only. Artists may call 836-3098 after 12:00 to see if they have an art piece to pick up.

Works accepted and exhibited must be picked up at the JKH on Thursday, April 6th, between 9:00 AM and 10:30 AM.


